

Students and families at Floyd Light were surveyed in December 2021 about their perceptions of their school in terms of Engagement, Academic Challenge, Culture, Belonging & Peer Collaboration, and Relationships. In addition, students provided feedback about School Safety, Emotional and Mental Health, and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

We heard from 105% of students and 20% of families.

With the help of the nonprofit YouthTruth, we analyzed their responses to use for decision-making and improvements. Here are a few things we learned from the survey:

The amount of students who feel that their teachers want them to explain their answers - why they think what they think.

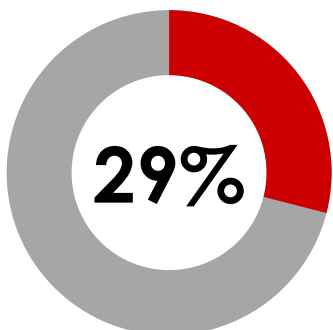


The amount of students who feel that they try their best in school.

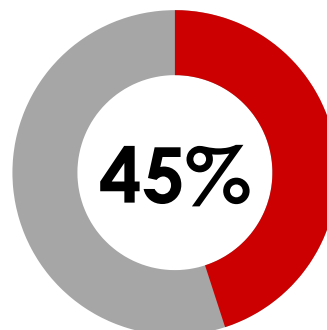


The amount of families who feel comfortable approaching teachers about their child's progress.
